### Introduction

#### Golden Time – Procedure to Compliment the Behaviour Policy

The children of St Charles RC have written their own Golden Rules which are as follows:

- 1. We are respectful to one another**
- 2. We walk and speak quietly around school**
- 3. We play games that do not hurt each other**
- 4. We use everyone's own name**
- 5. We look after our own and each other's belongings**

**FOLLOWING THE GOLDEN RULES = GOLDEN TIME**

Golden Time will take place for all classes from Nursery to Year 6 on a Friday afternoon between 2.30pm and 3.30pm.

The children are able to use special Golden Time equipment purchased for their class from donations from the Friends of St Charles.

The children have chosen how to spend the money on resources of their choice. The children may take part in special Golden Time activities such as Outdoor Games Club on a rota basis.

Every Monday in Collective Worship Mrs Campbell gives the children in each class 30 minutes of Golden Time for their Golden Time clock in class.

As a class, the children may earn up to 60 minutes Golden Time for good behaviour, this is rewarded to the whole class 5 minutes at a time.

Individually, children may lose Golden Time if they do not follow the Golden Rules. Golden Time can be taken away, 5 minutes at a time.

Each half term, there will be a Golden Time reward such as a trip, or party for the children who have not missed any Golden Time that term.

Children who have broken the Golden Rules will not be able to attend the reward.

- If they have missed 5 minutes, they may attend the reward, but miss 5 minutes.
- If they have missed 10 minutes, they may attend the reward but miss 10 minutes.
- If they have missed 15 minutes, they may attend the reward but miss 15 minutes.
- If they have missed more than 15 minutes of Golden Time that term, they will not be able to attend the Golden reward event.
- Parents will be informed that their child will not attend.

At St Charles RC we are committed to the Roman Catholic ethos of forgiveness and giving children a second chance. The children who do not attend the reward will give their suggestions for the next Golden reward and all staff will support them to improve their behaviour so that they will attend the next Golden reward event.
