

Family Communications?

This year's World Communications Day comes roughly half-way between the two Synods of Bishops on the Family, so Pope Francis has chosen to focus on the family as "A Privileged Place of Encounter with the Gift of Love". He says some beautiful things about families, but he is not speaking about some ideal or perfect family, as you will see if you read his message. Here are some reflections on the message.


Let us start with the conclusion of the message, its last two paragraphs; there we find a phrase that sounds obvious, but it bears pondering: "Families should be seen as a resource rather than as a problem for society". That would be a remarkable element in a party manifesto, would it not? Families that are healthy, above all in terms of their internal relationships, are an invaluable asset in any society. These paragraphs urge us to work "to build a better future for the world in which we live" rather than "fighting to defend the past". There is a hint here not to be weighed down by the enormous challenges of changing legislation on marriage and the family, because that can distract us from the need to do all we can to help real families in their real lives, with all the difficulties they can have. This spurs us into creative mode: how do I support the people sitting in front of me on a Sunday rather than turning family life into "a subject of debate or a terrain for ideological skirmishes"? *continued over...*

Further Ahead.....

First Holy Communions. The children of our Sacramental Programme will be making their First Holy Communions after the half-term holidays on **Sundays 14, 21, 28 June and 5 July**, spread over all the Masses. The final celebration of their programme will be on Sunday 19 July.

The Apostleship of the Sea will be coming to say something about their work on the **weekend 6/7 June**. It will be good to catch up with them again and finding out where all the woolly hats many of you made for them ended up!

Annual Foreign Mission Appeal.

The Montfort Missionaries have been allocated our deanery for their 2015 appeal and are busy organising their schedule. I am hoping they will be able to do this on a weekend I am away in September as Father Frank will not be available that particular date!

We can find ourselves locked into discussions often dictated by the media, rather than rejoicing in family life "as a setting where we can all learn what it means to communicate in a love received and returned". The Holy Father is certainly not suggesting that we should ignore the way some politicians, academics and others have chosen to dismantle traditional visions of marriage and the family. He is saying that we should emphasise our positive message of encouragement and support for families, while never abandoning those debates. As he says, "All too often things get simplified, different positions and viewpoints are pitted against one another, and people are invited to take sides, rather than to see things as a whole". He wants us to do our best to ensure that the life of families does not become 'collateral damage' in an ideological battle. Two Important Years...

Year of Consecrated Life.

This began on the First Sunday of Advent and in announcing this year, Pope Francis said "Religious should be men and women able to wake up the world."
 There will be a number of events in the diocese but more locally I have invited our own local community of Religious to make a presentation/install a display of their work. *They will do this on World Mission Sunday, weekend, 17/18 October.*

Jubilee Year of Mercy.

On Friday 13th March, Pope Francis made a surprise announcement in his homily at a Penitential Service in Rome: he announced an extraordinary Holy Year with the theme of mercy and forgiveness, to take place from 8th December 2015 (The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception) to 20th November 2016 (The Solemnity of Christ the King). The beginning of the Holy Year also marks the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council in 1965. *There will be a number of diocesan and more local events to mark this. Watch this space!*
