Investigative theme:
New Life/Growth

Dear Parents/Carers,

In this Summer 1 half term we will be focusing on;

Religion of faith."

"Jesus' life, death and resurrection are the central event of all human history and at the heart

We will be talking about New Life and we will offer children opportunities to:

- Begin to understand that because Jesus rose from the dead we can experience Easter;
- Know the story of Jesus appearing to Mary Magdalene when he rose from the dead and begin to understand why this story is important.
- Begin to understand the special gift of joy and peace that Jesus gave to the disciples and can give to us.
- Know the story of Jesus going back to his Father in heaven.

Communication Language Literacy and Writing -

Supporting the children's language skills through rhymes, songs and stories. We will plan with the children activities that they enjoy, focusing on communication, intonation, rhythm, phrasing and building on their existing phonic knowledge. We will continue supporting writing skills and reading. Our topic is new life and growth so we will learn the process and follow instructions to help us plant seeds and bulbs.

Mathematics

The children will be encouraged to show an interest in shape and space, to show an awareness of shapes in the environment and to use and understand positional language. We will use mathematical language to describe a journey to school or around the school grounds describing position and direction. We will revise the 2D shapes and introduce the children to 3D shapes. We will also continue to play board games involving counting, sorting and recognising numbers.

Understanding of the World

We will encourage the children to show an interest in the world in which they live, introducing them to new information and encouraging and extending their own ideas. This half term we will have an incubator in Nursery and some fertile eggs and hopefully we will see little chicks hatching! The children will be able to handle and care for the chicks during their stay with us. We will encourage the children to use nonfiction books, the internet and television to gather factual information about our topic. We will scaffold their natural curiosity about why things happen and how things work, teaching them to use simple equipment correctly and realise tools can be used for a purpose.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will encourage the children to play as a group, extending and elaborating their play ideas e.g. building up a role-play activity with their friends, initiating play, offering cues to peers to join them and to keep play going by responding to what others are saying or doing. The children will be encouraged to talk freely about their home and community, to be confident in linking up with others for support and guidance and also to realise the needs of others. We will also encourage the children to express their feelings about personal events.

Expressive Art and Design

We will encourage the children to talk about the things they create indicating personal satisfaction or frustration. We will encourage them to use available resources to create props to support their role-play. The children often notice what adults do and imitate what is observed and then doing it spontaneously when the adult is not there, we will record these observations. We will explore colour, shape and begin to differentiate between colours and we will encourage the children to describe the texture of things. We will give the children opportunity to explore different materials creatively making 3D models or mobiles.

Physical Development

The children will be encouraged to show respect for each other's personal space when playing together in groups and to collaborate in devising and share tasks, including those which involve accepting rules. The children will also be encouraged to show their awareness of a range of healthy practices with regard to eating, sleeping and personal hygiene.

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Last terms special times

Our topic was 'Minibeasts' and we focused on bees, worms, caterpillars and butterflies and the children can discuss the butterfly life cycle confidently.

The children loved performing their Mothers Day assembly for you and then inviting you to lunch, I hope you all enjoyed it as much as they did!

The children have a sound knowledge of the life of Jesus and they can all contribute to class discussions about the Easter story. We have all enjoyed the Easter activities in school.
